COLLABORATION WITH DPPI/1

A joint IPA DRAM and DPPI SEE (Disaster Preparedness and Prevention Initiative for South Eastern Europe) workshop was held in Ljubljana, to discuss if and how some of the work done by the Programme can be carried on by DPPI to ensure sustainability. DPPI SEE and IPA DRAM representatives gathered to discuss the relevance and feasibility of the work IPA DRAM has been carrying out in the region in the context of DPPI SEE. The workshop offered the possibility to present DPPI SEE and IPA DRAM in their organizational context. Participants recognized that both of these initiatives have commonalities in that both promote member ownership and strive to enhance disaster risk management capacity at national and regional levels by provide services relevant to its members. Furthermore, participants to the workshop agreed that these commonalities and the experience of IPA DRAM in providing services to its partner countries were relevant in the context of DPPI SEE's ambition and future plans. The workshop included a comparative analysis of DPPI SEE to carry on the IPA DRAM workshop and a team building exercise called "the Marshmallow challenge".

guarantee the sustainability of the system once IPA DRAM Programme will be over. The Members of DPPI decided to develop, with support of IPA DRAM, an Action Plan for transferring ERRA to DPPI secretariat.

IPA DRAM has also presented the on-going updates of seeKMS platform. seeKMS is a Knowledge management system (KMS), owned by DPPI, that contains an archive of disaster risk management information and allow users to retrieve data through a user-friendly interface. It can also assist the coordination among different regional stakeholders and minimize duplication of initiatives and studies. IPA DRAM is improving the seeKMS platform by simplifying the access to information. An initial version of the platform will be presented during the Regional Workshop in Rome and finalized by the end of 2019.

DESINVENTAR SENDAI IN MONTENEGRO

On the 40th anniversary of the devastating earthquake that hit Montenegro (April 15, 1979), the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism organized a Conference in Podgorica to assess the results achieved by institutions and to initiate the implementation of disaster loss database DESINVENTAR SENDAI, and to announce, in cooperation with the UN Office for Disaster Risk Reduction, a new database on damage from disasters, including earthquakes, The system unifies all historical data on disasters in the country to enable the full picture on disaster risk, including earthquakes and climate change related events, meeting the Sendai Framework Goals. The project was supported by the IPA DRAM Programme.

ADVISORY MISSION IN ALBANIA

The objective of the technical workshop was to progress in the National Disaster Risk Assessment in Albania, providing assistance in the development of risk scenarios. Thematic working groups on floods, earthquakes and forest fires were to develop scenarios for each of the three hazard types and defining which types of maps could support the scenarios' description.

The aim with the advisory mission also included a bilateral session with General Directorate of Civil Emergency (GDCE) in order to consolidate how to proceed with the Technical Guidelines, which thresholds to use and the roadmap forward to perform the NDRA in Albania.
